DO YOU KNOW WHAT THE SYMBOLS ABOVE STAND FOR?

From Top to Bottom, Left to Right

BRAKE - Braking system is not working properly. This can be caused by warped rotors, low brake pads or a leak in the brake fluid line.

COOLANT - Blue Color is good, Red is bad.
BRAKE FLUID - Low brake fluid.

BRAKE PADS - Low brake pads.

ENGINE - There are issues with the engine. If this light comes on get to a repair shop as soon as possible.

BATTERY - System is detecting either a low charge on battery or an error in the charging system.

START SYSTEM - Start system fault.

OVERHEATING - Engine coolant tempera-

ture indicator.

SEAT BELT REMINDER - Buckle up for safety!

TRANSMISSION - There is an issue with the drive train.

OIL LEVEL - Low Oil or no Oil in your engine. ABS - A problem with the electronic control of the braking system.

ELECTRONIC BRAKING - There is an issue with the electronic braking system.

POWER STEERING - Trouble with power steering

SERVICE REMINDER - Many vehicles have built in intervals for standard maintenance based on manufacturer specs.

MASTER WARNING LIGHT - There should be text on your dash explaining the issue. If not take your car in for service check immediately.
